

March 5, 2018

The Wimbledon City Council convened in regular session with Mayor Pickar presiding. Present were Councilmen Plumb and Guscette. Also present was Mary Beth Olombel.

The minutes of the February meeting were read and approved.

Old Business:

Discussed the results of the town hall meeting. Also discussed some of the suggestions made by the Wimbledon Liveable Community Committee.

Auditor is to contact the North Dakota Health Dept. about condemning some of the rundown buildings in the city.

New Business:

Auditor reported that the city will be responsible for the engineering, legal and administrative fees connected with the costs of installing a new standpipe. The amount of these fees will amount to approximately \$16,500. Councilman Plumb made a motion, seconded by Guscette, to proceed with the project. Ayes 2 and Nays 0.

Discussed spring cleanup. Decided to tentatively set spring cleanup for the first week of May.

Councilman Plumb reported that ADM had donated a concession stand to the park. Wimbledon Improvement Corp. to pay for the cement if the city will pay for getting the slab ready. Councilman Guscette, made a motion, seconded by Plumb to be responsible for getting the slab ready. Ayes 2 and Nays 0.

Discussed the problem of renters moving without paying up their utility bills, it was suggested that landlords will receive the water bill and they can charge enough rent to cover the utilities, as according to ordinance, the homeowner is already responsible for unpaid services.

Councilman Guscette, made a motion, seconded by Plumb, to pay all bills. Ayes 2 and Nays 0.

There being no further business to come before the council, the meeting was adjourned.
