The Wimbledon City Council convened in regular session with Councilman Smith presiding. Present were councilmen Bakken, Hoggarth and Plumb. Also present were Barb Samek Mavis Kinzler, Les Koll and Mary Beth Olombel.

The minutes of the March meeting were read and approved with one correction. The Correction was all dogs must be licensed to establish ownership and prove rabies shots are up to date, not all shots.

Old Business:

✓ Third reading of the dog ordinance. Motion made by Hoggarth, seconded by Bakken, to adopt dog ordinance. Ayes 3 and Nays 0. ✓

New Business:

Le Koll gave a report on Maintainer repairs beginning to add up. Would the council consider assisting the township with upgrading the maintainer? Council agreed to consider and less will research the possible upgrade and trade -in.

Concerns were brought up about the community burn pile east of the Church. Discussed other locations and its purpose and convenience to the community. Also asked about the legality of burning leaves in town.

Spring cleanup and the possibility of a roll-off dumpster as in the past. Cost of the roll-off and misuse of dumpster was discussed. Discussed unkept yards and old cars. City already has an ordinance in place.

Complained about vehicles driving erratically and noisily at all hours of the night. Patrons are encouraged to call the sheriff's department with complaints.

First reading of Ordinance authorizing the grand of Cable communications franchises in the city of Wimbledon setting forth conditions accompanying the grant of the franchises as requested by Midcontinent Communications.

Councilman Plumb, made a motion, seconded by Bakken to pay all bills. Ayes 3 and Nays 0.
